The Chair, Chuck Smithwick, called the meeting to order and welcomed everyone. The roll was called and there were 12 of 19 members present representing the LNBA and 14 of 24 members present representing the NRCA. There was a quorum present for both associations and guests were introduced and recognized.

Board Minutes – The Board Minutes for the February 1, 2024 meeting were presented. Being no revisions, Jimmy Pridgen made the motion to approve, seconded by Dan Wall, and approved by the Boards.

LNBA/NRCA Financials – *Treasurer's Report* – Jimmy Pridgen presented the Treasurer's Report for the period of February, March, and April, 2024 to the Board. As of April 30th, the LNBA account balance is \$244,476.06 and NRCA account balance is \$355,51.23. Also available for the Board's review were the year-to-date expenditures for both associations. Following discussion, Dan Wall made the motion to approve the reports as presented, seconded by Jimmy Pridgen, and approved by the Boards, respectively.

Mclawhorn Law Agreement – Haywood reported to the Board the agreement with McLawhorn Law would expire Jume 30th and recommended to the NRCA Board to renew for another year. Following discussion, Jonathan Bulla made the motion to approve, seconded by Reggie Hicks, and approve by the Board.

Executive Director Service Agreement – Chuck presented the Boards with the terms of the Executive Director Service Agreement that PCi was requesting. The term would be 3 years at an hourly amount of \$85 (budgeted at 1,040 hours annually), and reimbursable expenses including the cost of the financial software. Haywood noted that he is entering into his sixteenth year serving the Boards and noted it has been a pleasure to see the work the members have achieve in reducing nitrogen from their facilities. Following discussion, Jonathan Bulla made the motion to authorize the Chair to execute the agreement, seconded by Ed Buchan, and approved by the Boards.

Neuse Watershed Modeling Update – Haywood presented a memorandum from Dr. Marty Lebo on the work his firm has completed to date. The review is continuing with the draft watershed model should soon

be delivered to the Division.

LNBA Updates –

Work continues on the Lower Neuse River Monitoring Service Contract No. 6 with Waypoint Analytical. All sampling was completed in November and December with the exceptions listed below:

Memorandum of Agreement with DWR (July 31, 2024) – The draft agreement from DWR has been received and distributed to the Executive Committee for review. The signature authority list has been updated so please review the list. If any changes occur related to the signature authority between now and completion of the MOA agreement please contact me immediately.

LNBA Annual Report for 2023 – Haywood reported the LNBA Annual Report was submitted as required by the Memorandum of Agreement. Graphs illustrating the annual nitrate-nitrite and TKN concentrations and one illustrating the nitrogen concentrations for the past 10 years were presented.

NRCA Updates –

NRCA Permit Renewal Update – Haywood reported that the NRCA has not received notice of its permit renewal request. The Executive Committee received a draft in January and submitted draft comments to the Division. Haywood recommended the NRCA Board approve the draft comments and submit to the Division for the record. Following discussion, Dan Wall made the motion to approve the comments and submit to the Division, seconded by Jimmy Pridgen, and approved by the NRCA Board.

NRCA Annual Report for 2023 – Haywood reported the NRCA annual report was submitted as required by

the Association's NPDES permit. The members delivered 2.51 mg/L of total nitrogen to Neuse estuary for 2023. The NRCA is currently at 42% if its permit nitrogen allocation for end of pipe discharged effluent.

Annual Training Workshop Committee – Haywood reported the committee was close to completion on the program for 2024. The dates for the workshop are July 30th in Raleigh and August 1st in Kinston. Registration will begin in early June.

LNBA/NRCA Delegates – Haywood reminded the membership to please keep the membership delegates updated by notifying him.

The next meeting is scheduled for September 5, 2024 at 10:00 hosted by the City of Goldsboro. With no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

SUBJECT: Neuse Watershed Model Review Update

DATE: August 28, 2024

PROJECT OBJECTIVE

The overall objective for the project is to review the watershed model being developed by RESPEC under contract with NCDEQ for use in evaluating transport factors for Nitrogen in the Neuse River basin.

BACKGROUND

The authorized project focuses resources on evaluating the calibration of key components of the watershed model when the calibration is nearly complete. Key components are how the model simulates flow throughout the watershed, how the model simulates the deposition and erosion of particles, and how the model simulates the transformations of different forms of nitrogen.

The WSP team participated in a discussion with the model development team (RESPEC) and staff from NCDWR on September 25, 2023, on progress in model development through the time of the meeting. Access to modeling files during the development process was requested and granted.

RECENT ACTIVITY

The WSP project team has been able to gain access to modeling files from RESPEC and has evaluated the calibration of water movement and nitrogen concentrations throughout the watershed. Some recent activities are:

- February 27, 2024 memo on calibration of flows provided to client and modeling team.
- March 23, 2024 model results for water quality and revised flows received.
- April 24, 2024 internal evaluation of updated flow calibration provided to client. The updated flow calibration showed some improvements in response to the comments provided by WSP on February 27, 2024.
- June 19, 2024 memo on revised calibration of flows and calibration of water quality parameters provided to client and modeling team. Areas for improvement

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in simulated water temperature and nutrient parameters were identified for the model development team.

ANTICIPATED SCHEDULE

A draft model development report has been prepared and is in NCDEQ review. WSP will request a copy for review to provide an assessment of how well the model simulates flow and nitrogen delivery to the Neuse Estuary. RESPEC provided an update to WSP on August 28, 2024, on the modeling report review status.

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

"I am the Executive Director of the Lower Neuse Basin Association and Neuse River Compliance Association and our member, the City of Wilson, received the attached letter. The letter is of interest but we would like more information regarding this program such as what are you calling a "peer group"? Is this comparison based on permitted discharge flow, facilities located in the same river basin, and what are the permit parameters (such as advance secondary treatment, tertiary treatment, or advanced treatment (biological nutrient removal facilities)? I can be reached at 919.796.8049".

"Thank you for your email message. I am happy to try to answer your questions. First, you inquire about the "peer group". For the project, we defined the peer group as all National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES)-regulated facilities operating in the same state that discharge biological oxygen demand (BOD) into surface waterbodies. Second, you inquire whether the comparison was based on particular factors. We did not base the comparison on permitted discharge flow. Instead, we focused on the permitted discharge limit regarding the amount of wastewater pollution. We did not base the peer group on the same river basin but rather the same state. And we did not base the comparison on the type of treatment; again, we focused on the permitted amount of pollution (i.e., effluent limit). I hope that my answers satisfactorily answer your questions. If not, I am happy to elaborate.

This informational letter was our first attempt to provide peer comparisons to facilities in EPA Regions 3 and 4, and we appreciate any feedback on the letter. We had discussed over many months how best to construct the peer groups and we decided to start with a broad group using a common pollutant.
