The Chair, Barry Parks, called the meeting to order and welcomed everyone. The roll was called and there were 13 of 18 members present representing the LNBA and 16 of 24 members present representing the NRCA. There was a quorum present for both associations. Guests were introduced and recognized.

**Board Minutes** – The Board Minutes from the September 2, 2021 meeting were presented. Being no revisions, the minutes were approved as submitted.

**Financials** – *Treasurer's Report* – Donald Smith presented the Treasurer's Reports, August, September, and October, 2021 were presented to the Board. As of October 31st, the LNBA account balance was \$285,802.77 and NRCA account balance was \$323,469.29. T. J. Lynch made the motion to approve the reports as presented, seconded by Kenny Stevens, and approved by the Boards, respectively.

Continued Support for the Modmon Program – Haywood reported to the Board that future of the Modmon program is questionable. Hans Pearl, who runs the program, has reported the program is funded in the State's budget but the budget has yet to be adopted. The NRCA has been funding the program in the amount of \$5,000 annual for the past several years. Haywood reported the Finance Committee will be reviewing continued support of the program in January and will report to the Board their recommendation at the February meeting.

2020 LNBA/NRCA 990 Tax Returns – Haywood reported the 990 tax returns are prepared and ready for submittal to the IRS. If anyone has any questions please let me know. The returns are due to be filed by November 15, 2021.

*Internal Revenue Issue with 2019 Tax Return* – Haywood reported that notice had been received from the IRS that the issues surrounding the submittals of the 2019 990 tax returns has been resolved.

**NRCA Updates** – Haywood reminded those who may need to lease nitrogen in 2021 should be preparing their leases for 2021.

Siler City Speculative Limits – Haywood reported to the Board that Siler City received speculative limits for a proposed expansion and noted an organic nitrogen limit of 3.0 mg/L. Gary Perlmutter, permit writer with DWR, commented on the circumstances regarding the speculative limits. The concerns expressed with the organic nitrogen limit revolved around the fact that it was not clear if the 3.0 mg/L total nitrogen limit included the 3.0 mg/L organic limit or was in addition to the total limit. Haywood noted this is of concern and the NRCA may want to comment should a permit go to notice.

NRCA Executive Committee Discussion on Nitrogen Allocations – Haywood discussed issues surrounding the member nitrogen allocations and what direction the NRCA may consider in the future. The NRCA Executive Committee's discussed these issues following the September Board meeting. Barry Parks noted some members are leasing nitrogen without progress to improve their facilities to reduce end of pipe nitrogen discharges. It was suggested all members review their current operations and to keep Haywood updated on projects that will improve (reduce) the end of pipe nitrogen discharge.

NRCA Executive Committee Upcoming Meeting with DWR regarding the Neuse Watershed RFP – The executive committee has scheduled a meeting with DWR to discuss the RFP for the watershed model (from recent legislation). Of concern is the documents used in the RFP showing the Phase II proposed transport factor. The meeting is scheduled for November 19<sup>th</sup>. The information omitted from the RFP was the "hold harmless" portion in nitrogen loading allocations in the Phase II calculations.

All samples were collected and analyzed per the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) requirements in September with the following expect exceptions:

September - J4080000 (Poplar Creek at Bethlehem Road (SR 2049) near Knightdale) – unable to collect the field parameters (2<sup>nd</sup> set) due to the low water level. Full sample collection was accomplished on September 21<sup>st</sup>. September data is in final review.

All samples were collected and analyzed per the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) requirements in October. Laboratory analysis is on this data is ongoing at this time

\* No increase the proposed budget from FY 2022-23. Membership dues will vary from FY 2022-23 because of fluctuations in discharged nitrogen pounds. Budget does not include funding for the ModMon Program.

All sampling was completed by Environment 1 in November, December, 2021, and January, 2022. Data sets have been received through November, 2021 (and posted on website). December sampling results are in data review. All invoices through December, 2021 have been processed and paid.

All samples were collected and analyzed per the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) requirements in January, 2022. Laboratory analysis is on this data is ongoing at this time.

The LNBA is entering the 5<sup>th</sup> year of the 5 year agreement with Environment I for sampling the LNBA stations. The agreement is valid through December 31, 2022. I request authorization to enter into negotiations with Environment I to renew the agreement for another 5 years.

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The 2022 Draft 303(d) Listing and Integrated Report has been sent out for public comment and those comments are due February 28, 2022. Jay Sauber with Sauber Water Quality Consulting has reviewed both documents and will present his findings.
